# **School Census Shows Gain** In Population

en as a criterion, Hood River County is continuing to show a growth in population. Figures released yesterday by County School Superintendent L. B. Gibson reveal a total count of 3683 children in the county for the present year, as compared to 3584 for the year 1936. The census records children past four years old and under 20. Last year saw the largest school census the county had ever had, while 1937 passes last year's record mark by 99.


