Wine Rulings Await Action Of Council

Definite action on the Hood River City licenses for retailing beer and wine will be taken at Monday's session of the City Council, councilmen reported.

No applications have as yet been voted upon, and a proposal made last week to limit the sale of wine to specified establishments will await recommendations of the council's police committee before action is taken. The police committee will also make recommendations on applications for sale of beer.

Some Hood River citizens and council members have expressed themselves as favoring the adoption of regulations closing the doors at specified hours of firms that retail wine. Some are of the opinion that sale of wine could be regulated by having the dealers stop its sale at a specified hour, and refrain from selling wine on Sundays and holidays, though their establishments might remain open to transact other business.

The City Council of Cascade Locks listened Monday night to the reading of the Hood River County Court's resolution in regard to rejecting all applications under the court's jurisdiction. "Council members expressed themselves as amused at the wording of the resolution in which it is stated that the law does not require them to act on applications, but nevertheless they would mark all applications 'rejected,'" stated one of the Cascade Locks city fathers. The Cascade Locks Council proceeded to pass all applications of beer and wine dealers which had been presented to them. They state they have no liquor problem in Cascade Locks whatsoever.

FOREST FIRES FEWER

Increased caution on the part of the people using the forests, together with favorable weather conditions is considered largely responsible for the fact that 1937 forest fires in Oregon were held to an acreage of less than one-fifth of one per cent of the area under forest service protection, according to a report recently made to the U. S. forest service chief at Washington, D. C.

counties, but in Hood River this salary is included in the county budget.
