Bulletin Tells of Captain Bonneville

In his second bulletin on the "Bonneville Project," Administrator J. D. Ross gives the background of the big dam's namesake. The bulletin comprises a biographical sketch of Captain Benjamin Louis Eulalie de Bonneville, an account similar to the one published in The Chronicle fusion. several weeks ago.

In speaking of the early explorer, the bulletin remarks: "Few persons are acquainted with the historic westward trek of the explorer whose name is now commemorated by a 600,000 horsepower monument of steel and concrete at Bradford Island. Four years ago only a little hamlet on the railroad line and a few scattered landmarks recalled his name. but today thousands of tourists motor up the Columbia Gorge to visit the mile-long dam that stretches between the granite cliffs, a permanent reminder of the exploits of Captain Bonneville.
