Poultry Hints---

INTESTINAL PARASITES

Tape Worms: Infestation of flocks has become more acute in recent years, due to larger flocks on small places. Tape worms do considerable harm when the attack is acute. They give off poison which causes the destruction of the red blood cells and leaves the hen pale and anemic. Another poison affects the nerves and causes wry neck and leg paralysis. There will be many thin birds at this time.

Perhaps the most damage results from the weakened condition which predisposes the birds to other and more serious diseases such as colds, roup and pex.

Symptoms: An increased or ravenous appetite and increased amount of water consumed. Some lameness and wry neck. Sometimes segments of the tape worm which is triangular in shape and white can be found in the droppings, foamy whitish at first and later brownish as a result of slight hemorrhages in the intestines.

Treatment: The most satisfactory treatment is the use of individual three-way gizzard capsules. These will clean up all three—tape worms, round worms and pin worms. Be

sure to follow the instructions of the manufacturer.

Round Worms: The symptoms and results of these are so nearly the same as that of tape worms that the surest treatment is the above mentioned capsules.

In either case worms are usually worse in pullet flocks than in older birds. Pullets may be thrown into a false molt with an attack of worms.

Pin Worms: Are found in the caeca or blind pouches. They seem to cause very little damage to chickens except in very acute cases.

It is thought pin worms in young poults act as host for the germs that cause Black Head.

Plans Given For Saw Mill At Hood River

O. B. Aagard of Portland and associates Monday announced the purchase of the Dr. B. E. Wright property located across the Union Pacific tracks from the spray plant within the city limits of Hood River for the construction of a sawmill to employ from 50 to 200 men depending on the number of shifts the mill will be operated.

Aagard appeared before the Hood River Council Monday night and before the Hood River Chamber of Commerce forum meeting Tuesday noon to explain his plans for the new industry which he expects to incorporate for \$100,000. His mission in Hood River at the present is to solicit financial aid and support for the venture. The local aid he claims will be augmented by a considerably larger proportion of outside capital.

This site Aagard states is the most ideal location of any on the Columbia River for his purpose. With the lake to be formed by the Bonneville Dam raised to its full level the location will be between the railroad and the slough just north of the tracks west of Hood River.

Aagard formerly operated a mill at Kalama, Washington, which suffered in the freshet of 1933.
