## BEER MONEY ALLOTTED

Hood River County's share of the privilege tax on beer collected by the Oregon liquor commission the last quarter of 1937 amounted to \$207.64, a report of the commission published Saturday shows. The city of Hood River received a sum of \$92.62 in the division of the \$22,041.12 divided by the state. The proportionate share of each county is determined by the total population of the counties of the state less the combined population of all incorporate cities in each county.
