C. D. Nickelsen
Backed for
Congress

Pre-primary politics are beginning to take form in the Second congressional district with the recent endorsement by the Townsend Club of Lakeview of C. D. Nickelsen, Republican, of Hood River, for congressman from this district. Nickelsen was a candidate two years ago, endorsed by the State Townsend convention, and polled 6642 votes, with three other Townsend candidates running in the field polling a total of 8853 votes. The Townsend vote in the second congressional district two years ago as expressed by the vote for the four candidates amounted to 15,437, Roy Ritner, the regular Republican nominee receiving 7479 votes.

It is expected that the District Board of the Townsend clubs will endorse the slate proposed by the Lakeview club, and that there will be only one candidate nominated and supported on each party ticket for the same office by the Townsend group at this election. Mr. Nickelsen stated today when asked for his decision, that he was not a professional politician and was not seeking the congressional post now held by Pierce. However, if the electorate of this congressional district are insistent that he become a candidate, that he will give the matter consideration.

Freight Craft
Being Built
For Up-River

Upper Columbia River operators will watch with interest the construction of a 601foot shallow draft tug and two 75-foot oil barges which are reported being built in Seattle from designs drawn by H. C. Hansen, naval architect, for the account of Edward C. Condon, Duluth, Minn.

The tug will have a breadth of 18 feet and draft of only 18 inches, powered by two high-speed Diesels motors. It will compare favorably with the tug Mary Gail, of similar length, which Hansen designed for Birk Thompson, Spokane oil distributor, for use on the upper Columbia.

The barges will be about 15 feet shorter than the barge Hensen built for Thompson, and it is believed would be easier to handle in the swift water of the upper Columbia than Thompson's barge.

No announcement has been made of the future uses to which the new tug and barges will be put.

Cross Bay Bridge
In 78-Mile Gale

Returning last week from a 10-day stay in San Francisco, Mr. and Mrs. C. O. Huelat of the Hood River Lenora Specialty Shop brought back accounts of the ferocity of the recent California storm. During the height of gale, the Huelats drove across the San Francisco Bay Bridge while a 78-mile-an-hour wind was blowing. The car swayed and weaved, but no noticeable shaking of the bridge was observed. Planning to leave Berkeley Sunday, the Hood River folks discovered 12 trains tied up due to the storm damage. Mr. and Mrs. Huelat postponed their departure until Tuesday and made the return trip unimpeded by wash-outs or slides on the railroad. Attending market week in San Francisco, Mr. Huelat reports buyers of the west optimistic, with no moaning on their part about the business "recession".

Pipes To Be Made
Near Coulee Dam

Steel penstock pipes so large that they cannot be moved by railroad have been placed under contract for the dam at Grand Coulee. The Bureau of Reclamation has prepared a site for their manufacture about three and one-half miles west of the dam.

The largest of these pipes, 18 in number, will be 290 feet long and 18 feet in diameter. Each will be imbedded in concrete and feed one of the turbines. Nine turbines will be installed in each of the two power houses on opposite sides of the stream. Steel plates will be shipped from plants in Alabama and Eastern centers.

The contract price is \$1,456,000, under an award to the Western Pipe & Steel Company of California. The contractor has 30 days in which to begin the job and 1000 days within which to complete it.

Injured Man's
Wife Charged
With Assault

Glen Ordway, Belmont fruit grower, lies in a hospital today injured seriously but not critically as a result of an altercation Sunday night in which he was stabbed in the abdomen with a paring knife. Charges of assault with a dangerous weapon have been placed against his wife according to District Attorney John Baker. A new grand jury which will hear the case will be impaneled March 7.

Disagreement arose between Ordway and his wife at his home two miles south of here Sunday night at 8:40. Ordway was removed to the hospital after the fray where an emergency operation was performed and where he is making satisfactory recovery. Mrs. Ordway was taken into custody by the sheriff, but she was released under \$2000 bond.

Persons present at a party at the Ordway home where the altercation took place were questioned by the district attorney. Bud Sandman, said to have been in the room when the stabbing took place, was turned over to the authorities to serve out a pending sentence on bad check charges. He had been arrested September 3, pleaded guilty, was fined \$25 and sentenced to five months in jail, but was paroled after 15 days with the provision that he refrain from writing checks and abstain

from intoxicating liquor. Evidence Sunday night indicated he had violated his parole.

Philip Wilde, present at the Ordway party Sunday night prior to the stabbing, was apprehended near the home in an automobile. He pleaded not guilty to charges of drunken driving and is held in default of \$200 bond.

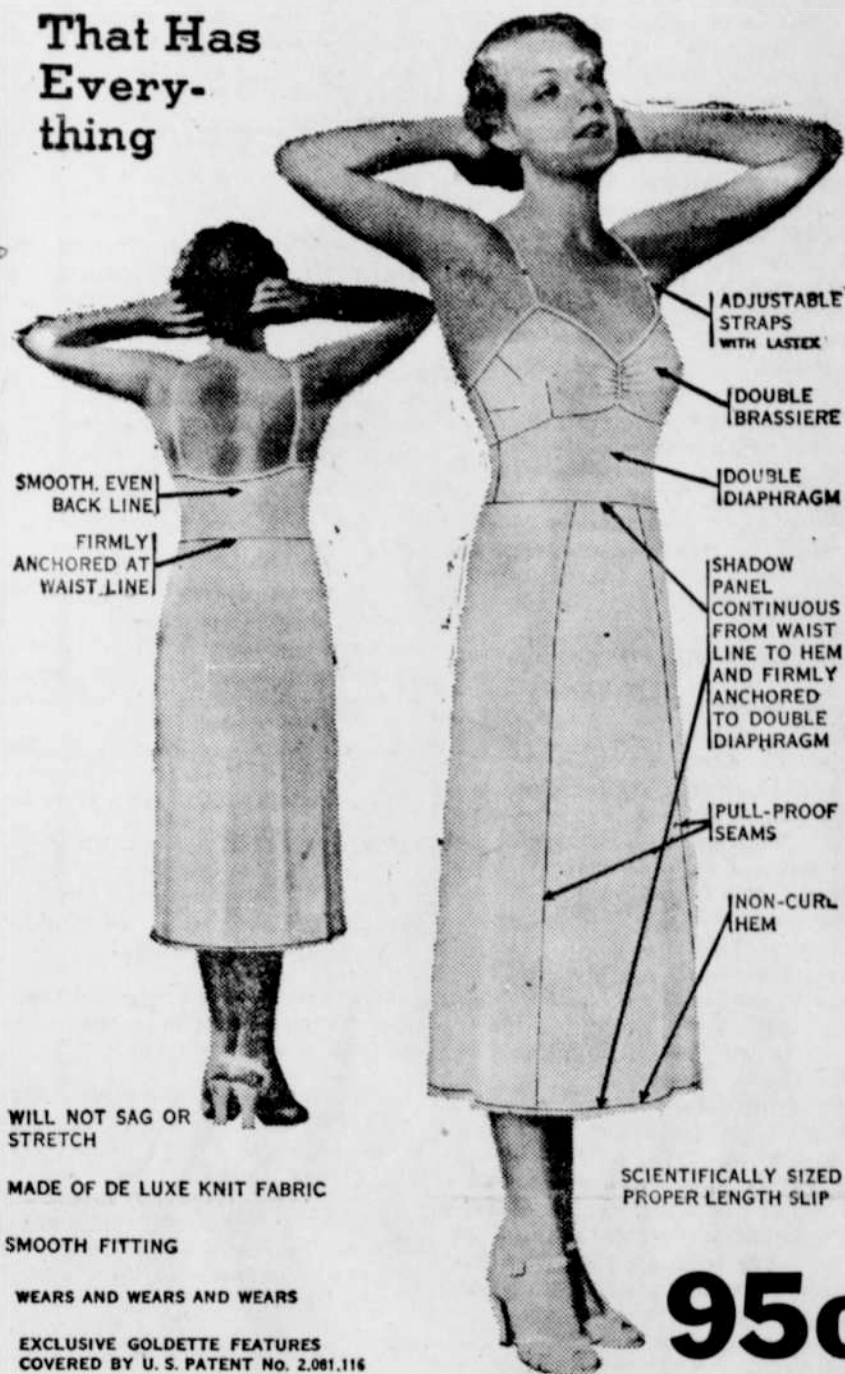

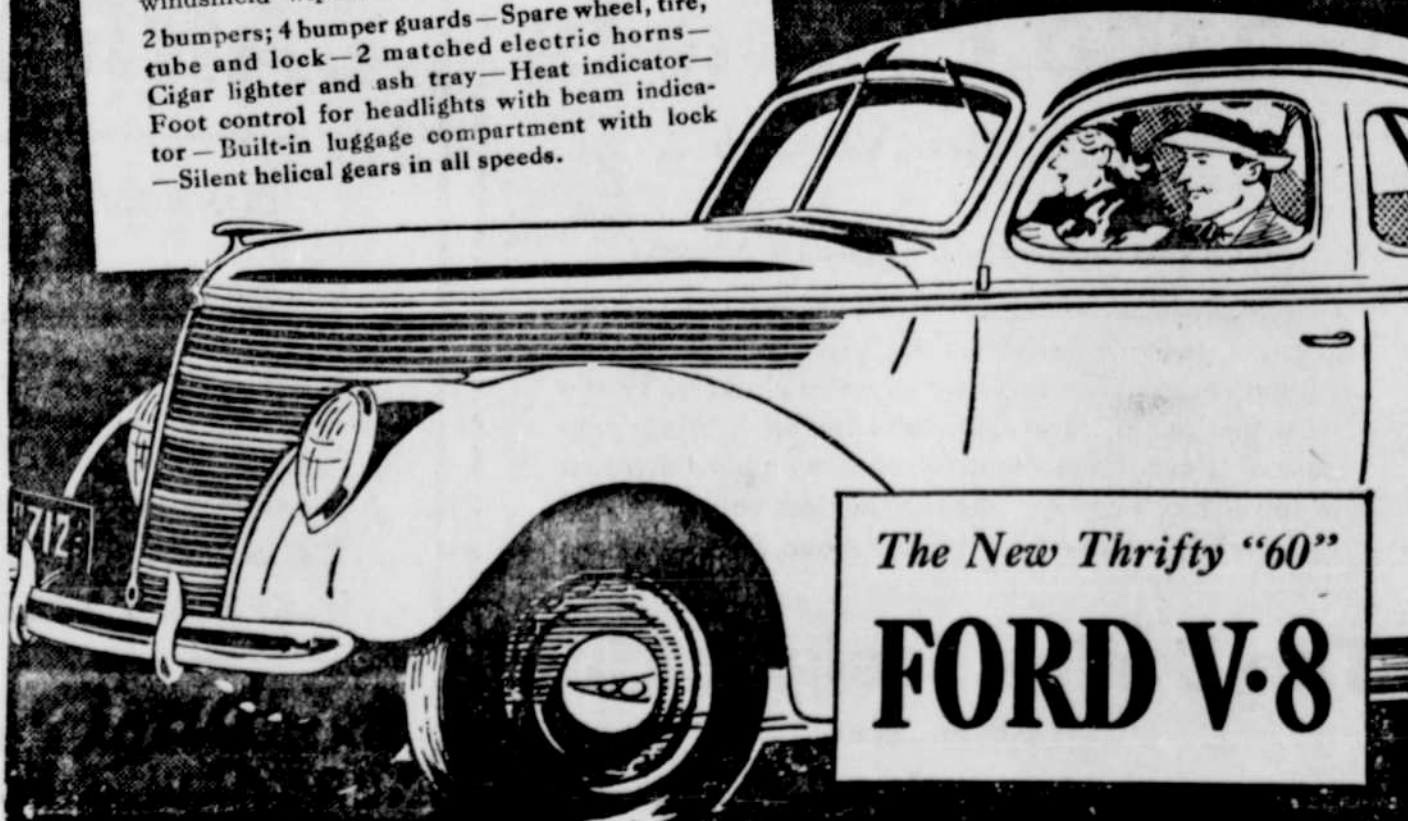
