

Antique of Local Family Pictured in National Magazine

The pattern of a platter owned by Mrs. Clara Marlor of May Street Road was used as the cover design of the March issue of the "Hobbies" magazine, published in Chicago, it was revealed last week when the magazine was distributed. Mrs. Marlor's platter, which has been in her family for more than 90 years, was photographed and the picture sent to the magazine company, who made the engraving and used it to adorn the magazine cover. A caption under the illustration said: "From the collection of Clara Blythe Marlor."

The picture sets forth a view of Sandusky Bay in Ohio, showing buildings of the city in the background, with a group of sailboats in the foreground. The largest of the group of boats distinctly bears the name "Henry Clay." The late Samuel Finley Blythe, Mrs. Marlor's father was a Hood River orchardist and newspaper man. He published the Hood River Glacier from 1894 to 1904.

Speaking of the platter and the Blythe family, "Hobbies" said: "The blue Staffordshire platter on the cover of this issue is illustrated from the original belonging to Mrs. Clara Blythe Marlor of May Street Road, Hood River, Ore. Ohio folks will recognize it as the Sandusky platter, so named from the potter's conception of Sandusky, Ohio. The plate is known to have been in the Blythe family for 90 years. The late Samuel Finley Blythe, father of Mrs. Marlor, was one of the pioneers of Hood River Valley. His career began as a printer and newspaper man on the Chambersburg, Pa., Repository."

"Later he moved with his mother to Ohio, where he enlisted for service in the war between the states in Company E of the 22nd Ohio infantry. He saw three years of active service. He was with the army of Grant at Fort Donelson, Shiloh and Corinth. He participated in the siege and capture of Vicksburg and later was at the capture of Little Rock, Ark. When mustered out of the Ohio regiment, he re-enlisted with the second regiment of Hancock's veterans corps. His regiment had charge of the execution of Mrs. Surratt and other prisoners who were found guilty of complicity in the assassination of President Lincoln."

"Mr. Blythe went west soon after the war, where he resumed his career in newspaper and printing work."

"He was a relative of Samuel Finley, an early president of Princeton University. He was also related to Samuel Finley Morse, the inventor of the telegraph. The family came from sturdy Scotch-Irish ancestry. 'Is there a Sandusky platter with a more interesting background?'"
