The Hood River Hospital will join in observing National Hospital Day on May 12, according to the local hospital board, when, together with hospitals in America and in many countries throughout the world, it will welcome people into their wards, laboratories and departments, not as patients, but as guests.

First observance of National Hospital Day was held 17 years ago. The day was set aside as a Memorial to Florence Nightingale, and as a permanent living tribute to her

work for hospital advancement and service to the sick.

The Hood River Hospital will observe this day by having an "open house" for the public from 1 to 5 in the afternoon of Thursday, May 12. The public has been invited to call and examine the various departments of the hospital and have the equipment and departments explained by the hospital force.

NEW STATE-WIDE ORDER AFFECTS LOCAL CREAM PRICES

A new state-wide price order, effective Sunday, May 1st, as announced by the Oregon Milk Control Board, will affect local prices but slightly since the new order, the result of detailed investigation and public hearings in various markets, brings the price paid to producers to the same figure in all parts of the state and reduced the schedule in those markets where higher prices have been in effect to the same basis as the local schedule.

A slight reduction of one-half cent per pound butterfat in the price paid to producers shipping their milk to a distributor, resulting in uniform state-wide base price of 55c per pound butterfat is established by the order.

Boat Upsets; Rescuer Stalls Near Bank

Three Hood River youths narrowly escaped drowning Saturday afternoon when their sailboat overturned near the Washington shore above the mouth of the White Salmon river.

The three boys, Harold Buck Jr., Bobby Hilton and Jack Coppock, were rescued by a tug, operated by E. R. Johnson from Warrendale. In taking the boys aboard, the tug became fouled and caught the bank.

One of George Y. Morrison's boats went to the rescue from the Oregon side of the river and pulled the tug free.

TOURIST FARES ANNOUNCED BY UNION PACIFIC LINES
