School News

The Parent-Teachers Association of Bonneville presented to the eighth grade class of 1938 a prunus bleurina tree to plant on Arbor Day. This tree will also be a remembrance of this class. Mr. Gillet and Mr. Anderson were very kind to help the Parent-Teachers secure the tree.

Friday, May 6, there was a clinic for pre-school children between the ages of 2 and 6. Small-pox vaccination and diphtheria toxoid were given for the price of 15c and 25c. This has been arranged for the convenience of those who have not had the opportunity in the past and because of a possibility of no doctor in the community.

Audiometer tests were given to the students May 6, to detect and help correct hearing defectiveness.

Reading tests were given to all grades except the eighth by the Multnomah County School office and a battery of percentage problems have been given seventh and eighth graders by a Washington concern. This is to detect percentage difficulties encountered by school children.

Wednesday, May 4, the Bonneville School was pleasantly surprised by the P-T. A. The organization was very efficient in keeping all their plans a secret which made it a grand success. All parents and children joined in a pot-luck dinner and splendid gifts were given the faculty and others in conjunction with the school. We are very appreciative of all this kindness.

The fifth and sixth grades have received a very interesting package of letters and pictures from the Belle Point School, Fort Smith, Arkansas, with whom they have corresponded for two years. One of the outstanding facts learned was that Captain B. Bonneville, for whom Bonneville was named was three times commander at Fort Smith.
