## REGULATIONS RESCINDED

A public notice was issued recently by the Office of District Engineer, Bonneville District, in regard to the revocation of rules and regulations governing operation of Cascades Canal, Columbia River, which stated:

"The pool formed by the Bonneville Dam has flooded the Cascades Canal and locks at Cascade Locks, Oregon. The gates of the locks have been fastened in open position and the lock is now inoperative.

"The Rules and Regulations approved April 11, 1896, to govern the use, administration and navigation of Cascades Canal, Columbia River,

have accordingly been revoked by the Secretary of War under date of April 14, 1938."

## RECIPE
