Tacoma Claims Its Juice Rates Are Lower

Tacoma power rates are lower for plants operating ten hours per day or less than those recently announced for Bonneville, according to an announcement appearing in the "Tacoma Progress," official publication of the Tacoma Chamber of Commerce.

The statement, according to the article, was based on figures compiled by the industrial department of the Tacoma chamber.

It was admitted by the Tacoma article that the Bonneville rates, as announced, were lower on a power load of more than ten hours a day. However, the belief was expressed that the splendid condition of the Tacoma power system "offers opportunity for reducing or eliminating the advantage of Bonneville rates to the plant operating on a 24-hour basis."
