"HERE SLEEPS THE ANCIENT PEOPLE"

Bruno, with his silky gray braids and high-crowned hat. From points along the Columbia River came Joe Thomas, whose real name is Chawannai Tomahush, a grandson of old Chief Banaha.

Five Washington State highway patrolmen kept the road clear as automobiles began to crowd at the cemetery gate. Professional and amateur photographers began to trip camera shutters.

Then Richard Grace, assistant engineer of the army corps, called for silence and asked Captain Joseph Gorlinski, Bonneville Dam resident engineer, to explain the purpose of the gathering. When that was done Fred U. Robin, curator at Beacon Rock State Park, delivered an invocation to the Great Spirit first in Chinook jargon, then in English.

Forgetful that on the very island whence the mortal remains were resurrected, gallant Lieutenant Phil Sheridan and a handful of blue-clad troopers once held off Yakima and Cascade tribesmen in the uprising and massacre of 1856, the Indian speakers then told their red-skinned auditors that it was fitting that the army should have arranged the burial and provided the slim granite shaft, for "it was the army that first made contact with the Indians in establishing peace and order."

"It is significant," read C. R. Whitlock, superintendent of the Yakima Reservation in translating Jobe Charley's words, "that in this cemetery whites and Indians lie side by side, as in life today the two races live side by side."

Then Don Brown of Skamania County Historical society and Walter Hufford, Mayor of Stevenson, added their friendly words to those of official Indian representatives, Louis Andy, chairman of the Yakima council, Louis Brown, Thomas Sam, Sally Ann Stamill, Gus George and the others.

And finally, 79-year-old Mrs. Isabella Underwood, grand-daughter of Chief Banaha and sister-in-law of the founder of Underwood, Washington, was led forward to pull the cord that let the American flag fall away from the face of the gray "Ankuty Tillikum Museum—here the Ancient People Sleep."

Forest Service Lookouts on both the Columbia and Mount Hood National Forests overlook the timbered area where the Indian cemetery is located. An old barbed wire fence to keep stray cattle from molesting the graves has recently been replaced with a heavy woven wire fence fastened to the ground with steel posts.
