FSA Loans In This County Total \$32,345

Farm security loans totalling \$32,345 have been made to 51 Hood River farm families unable to secure adequate commercial credit for livestock, feed, seed, farm equipment and cooperative facilities, reports Milburn A. Stout, FSA supervisor, 2 Franz Building.

Farm and home plans providing for maximum production on the farm of food, feed and seed needs, as well as a crop and livestock program that provides the greatest cash income without depleting the soil, have been worked out by each FSA borrower and his wife with the aid of the supervisor. Each plan is designed to meet the individual family's needs, type of farm operated, and accumulated assets and liabilities.

Supplementing farm security plans, debt adjustment services have been made available to a number of families, and a community and cooperative service for canning equipment has been established. Community and cooperative services may be made available for families to jointly use purebred sires, heavy farm machinery, canning equipment and similar facilities, states Stout.

As stable tenure of a potentially productive farm is one of the requirements for an FSA loan, assistance in working out improved leases and rental agreements on a written basis to improve the relationship between the landowner and renter, has been extended to families.

Progress of farms cooperating in the program a year or more indicates that each has increased the net worth of his farm, has more livestock and a better crop and feeding program, while the homemaker has greatly increased the amount of food canned for the family and produced on the farm.

Succumbs to Injuries in Tunnel Mishap

Omer Otis James, 45, died Friday at the Hood River Hospital, after having sustained injuries when struck by a car at the Mosier tunnel two days before.

He was a native of Buckhart, Missouri, but had lived in Hood River for the past 18 years. Funeral services were held yesterday afternoon at 1:30 p. m., with the Rev. E. R. Delepine officiating, together with the American Legion. Interment was at Idlewild with full military services at the grave.

He is survived by his wife, Bertis A. James; two sons, Andrew and Raymond; his mother, Clara Ellen James of Hood River; a brother, Fred James of Hood River; and three sisters, Mrs. Mayme Bader of Stockton, California, Mrs. Grace Brougman of Stockton, California, and Mrs. Ethel Bard of Shenandoah, Iowa.

James was working as a flagman at the Mosier tunnel project when he was hit by a car driven by Raymond Hines of Mount Hood. The accident was attributed to faulty brakes.

Hines was held for grand jury investigation at The Dalles.
