For the first time in a number of years, Oregon automobile license plates will carry colors other than the black and white to which Oregon drivers have become accustomed according to an announcement made today by Secretary of State Earl Snell.

Proposals for purchase of the 1939 plates will call for a yellow background with black letters.

"Aside from the low cost factor, tests have proved that these two colors make the best combination for visibility, and should be an aid in safer driving," Snell stated.

## Automatic Machine Counts Passing Cars

Almost everyone, in driving the Rowent loops, has noticed the electrical robot built on one of the sharp curves, and has been told that it is a mechanical device for counting traffic. According to a recent bulletin from the U. S. Department of Agriculture, it is one of 350 such counters installed in 43 states making permanent records on typical highways. The robots operate with two beams of infra-red light, parallel and 30 inches apart, projected across the highway from a light box to the "eyes" to the counting device. The counter operates only when both beams are interrupted, as by a passing car. A passing pedestrian, interrupting only one beam at a time, is not counted. Counters are placed at strategic points where the highway is narrow or where cars are forbidden to pass—as on curves or the tops of hills. This limits the errors which would result if cars overlapped in passing. Other "misses" and "double counts" are possible, but the highway engineers find the robot counts almost as accurate as counts by observers, usually within 1.5 per cent.

The robot counts now cost, on the average, less than one-tenth as much as counts by observers, and costs are going down as the counters are improved mechanically. It is just another illustration of the fact that the mechanical man is now replacing the flesh and blood workmen in almost every kind of work.

## I Cover the Waterfront

Hood River was slightly (to say the least) left out of things last week-end. With Cascade Locks and Bonneville celebrating on one side of us, and the biggest crowds in the city's history thronging The Dalles on the other, there just wasn't anything left for us. But we saw the Charles L. Wheeler, Jr., go 'through—how could we help it? From the moment the first ship in the fleet poked her bow around the corner there wasn't a quiet moment until she nosed her way under the White Salmon bridge with a scant four feet clearing her foremast.

Incidentally, compliments flew all over the place when the coast guard cutter "Onondaga" followed the Wheeler into view. The Coast Guard ship is one of the trimmest, handsomest things to appear on the river yet. And now that a commercial ship and a coast guard cutter have shown the way, why couldn't The Dalles hold a fleet week and invite a few destroyers up? In fact, why couldn't Hood River?

It took a long time for the flotilla to pass Hood River; in fact, we never did know when they quit coming. For instance, take the case

of the "Stranger." Now, the "Stranger" is a nice old tub. For many and many a year she puffed up the rivers hauling all the things that a river boat hauls. The salt of the water, you might call the "Stranger." And it was only proper and fitting that she should come along on the trip. She'd given the best years of her life to the river, and she wanted to see all the sights.

So the "Stranger" came along; chartered by a group that could hardly be called salt water sailors—in fact, they weren't even fresh water sailors, from appearances. You might say they were "90 proof" sailors. They got as far as Hood River, and couldn't conceive of using water for anything except to sail upon, so they came ashore to fortify themselves. And when they started again (they had lost the caravan), there was the "Stranger," old and toil-worn, a regular pack-mule of a ship, behaving like a young pleasure cruiser. But that's the way a celebration affects a ship. No wonder the pilot expected trouble on the voyage back with the "Wheeler."

Salem, Ore., July 9—June distribution of benefit checks to jobless workers insured under the unemployment compensation law found Hood River, claim center for Hood River county, receiving \$6,199.77, for 1.1 per cent of the total for the state.

Reemployment in agricultural pursuits of a seasonal nature and further exhaustion of benefit rights for the current year accounted for a drop of 25 per cent to \$545,956 from the May total of \$730,102.
