Rock Crusher Purchased by Commissioners

Hood River county is the proud possessor of a new rock crusher. Tucked away on the property of Commissioner Joe Smullin near Parkdale the \$10,719 machine will within the next three weeks be moved to a crusher site above Dee. It will not be moved until its work is completed on the Smullin place.

The history of this machine is rather unusual. "The most mysterious deal I have ever seen carried out in Hood River county" was the comment of one disinterested county official. According to Commissioner Perry the machine was delivered to the Smullin place about one month ago, having been ordered about two months ago.

The purchase of the machine has never been discussed at any meeting of the county commissioners. No bill has been presented at any meeting of the county commissioners, yet last Friday, Commissioners Smullin and Perry called on Judge Ed Steele at his Market and asked him to sign a requisition for \$4000 payable to the Pioneer Portable Crusher people as a first payment on the new machine. Ed refused, which didn't make much difference to the commissioners, as their vote overruled his and the \$4000 requisition went through.

The two commissioners and the county judge sometime back had discussed the proposed purchase of a crusher informally but not at a regular meeting. Steele was not convinced of the good business of the county buying a new crusher.

As down payment, the Commissioners turned in about \$2000 worth of crusher equipment purchased by the county two years ago which had not been brought out of the warehouse in Portland. They received for this equipment which has never been used, \$1750. This leaves a balance of \$8969 to be paid. Four thousand of this was O.K.'ed on the requisition Friday. Next year's budget committee is faced with a \$4969 item to be paid off on this equipment. No sales contract is on file and apparently the only ones that have any knowledge of the financial transaction are Perry and Smullin.

The machine is a Pioneer Portable Crusher, capable of 100 yards per day (maybe) of inch-minus rock. Rollers can be added to make finer rock for oiling.

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
