

Girls Praise New Green Point Camp

Reports from Camp Defiance on Green Point Lake, where the Camp Fire Girls of Hood River County on Monday began their second week of summer camp, reveal that the new camp grounds are being used to excellent advantage.

Excellent progress has been made in swimming, while hiking, nature craft, camp craft, hand craft, and camp sports and fireside programs have been popular.

Mrs. C. W. McCain this week became director in the absence of Miss Evelyn Scott of Portland, who opened the camp on Monday of last week. Miss Scott, suffering from an impacted wisdom tooth, was obliged to return to Portland before the summer camp was concluded.

A cabin, built by the Carpenters' Union of Hood River, is now ready for use. Construction of another cabin, the donation of the Eagles' lodge is contemplated. At the present time, with the new Carpenters' Union building, the camp, started only a little more than a year ago, has a capacity for caring for 50 girls.

A Council Fire was held at the camp Monday evening, at which awards earned by the girls were made. On Saturday evening, the new fireplace was very much in use and a stunt program was staged.

Swimming has been excellent, according to the girls at the camp, and until Saturday, the smoke pall, which has been so general in the Mid-Columbia, had not reached the altitude of the Green Point camp. "And the food is excellent," remarked the girls.

Household Hints

Wash new hose before wearing as they will last longer. Rinse hose out after each wearing in mild suds and lukewarm water. Do not wring, squeeze them. Don't rub soap on hose.

Hot Weather Salad

Combine kidney beans, chopped sweet pickles and walnut meats. Pile on lettuce and arrange egg slices around base. Serve with mayonnaise or highly seasoned French dressing. Another combination is composed of shrimps, celery, green peas, hard-boiled eggs, garnished with tiny wedges of tomato and slices of cucumber.

ADDS TO EQUIPMENT

A STRAIGHT LINE

Specifications were announced last week on the Bonneville-Vancouver "backbone" transmission line. The government survey is virtually completed, and the next move will be to negotiate with property owners for a 300-foot right-of-way.

The transmission wires will run in a straight line from Beacon Rock to Vancouver, according to reports. Towers will be erected 1000 feet apart.

One million, eight hundred and twenty-five man hours of labor have been provided by a WPA project for clearing the 76-mile right-of-way from Vancouver to Bonneville and from Bonneville to Condit.
