Zone Change Asked For Ad. Building

Recommendation that the zone of property be changed to make possible the erection of an office building for the Bonneville administration has been made to the city council planning commission.

The planning commission recommended that the petition of the Lloyd corporation to change from zone 2 to 3 property on the north side of Northeast Lloyd boulevard between Eighth and Ninth avenues in Portland be granted.

Corporation to Build
The corporation will erect the building for the Bonneville administration, if the petition is granted, said the commission. The corporation is the owner of a large part of the affected property and of 82 per cent of the property in the petition area.

The corporation, said the report, has indicated there is a possibility of further development east and west of the petitioned block and that there are plans for a cultural center south of Holladay park and that these buildings would harmonize with the proposed office building.
