Dancers From Hollywood On Sojourn

After spending two weeks in Hood River at the Paradise Auto Park, Gloria and Woodrow Wilson, Mexican dancers left yesterday for Hollywood to begin work on a picture for Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer.

The brother and sister form a team of dancers which has been making a tour from Phoenix, Arizona north this summer as vaudeville and night club entertainers. Both have previously worked in pictures, Miss Wilson as a solo dancer, specializing in western pictures, and her brother

as a dancer in ensemble ball room scenes.

Two weeks ago their car overturned on the Mt. Hood Loop highway. Their mother, an occupant of the car was injured, and the couple was detained in Hood River until the mother was sufficiently recovered to travel, and until parts for their car, which was custom-built, could be secured.

The dancing couple showed none of the distasteful displays of artistic temperament for which some Hollywood actors are noted, according to attendants at the park. Miss Wilson even gave a dancing demonstration on one occasion for the benefit of the guests at the camp.

Recipes . . .

Uncooked Relish

3 red peppers, 12 cored green tomatoes, 12 cored red apples, 2 peeled onions, 2 cups vinegar, 2 cups granulated sugar, 5 tablespoons salt, ½ cup lemon juice, 1 tablespoon mustard seeds. Cut peppers into quarters, omit seeds and inner membrane. Put tomatoes, peppers, apples, onions, through food chopper using coarse blade. Add remainder and mix. Pour into hot sterilized preserve jars and seal. Makes 5 pints.
