years of age. Burning permits for burning slash or debris of any kind are required until December 31 unless fall rains allow the governor of the state to cancel the proclamation.

The violators, together with their crimes and sentences, are here listed.

On May 24th at 5:00 p. m. Ranger Weisendanger took Clayton Kain before Judge Eastman, charged with burning without a permit and negligence in permitting a fire to escape.

Kain pleaded guilty and was fined

\$25.00. Kain was responsible for the Multnomah Basin Fire.

On June 30th Mr. L. A. Clark of Cascade Locks, was found burning without a permit, which is a violation of Sec. 42-409, Oregon laws. He was notified to appear before Justice Stranahan at Hood River on July 6th at 2:00 p. m.

Justice Stranahan reported that Mr. Clark appeared and was fined \$25.00 and \$5.00 costs. \$30.00 of the fine was remitted.

On July 4, 1938, L. W. Serrell of 3233 N. E. 29th St., Portland, Oregon, was found shooting firecrackers on forest land, which is in violation of Chap. II, Sec. 42407 Oregon Forest Laws. Mr. Serrell was notified to appear before Justice Eastman at Gresham and was fined \$25.00.

On July 20, Mr. Robert W. Shaylor of 4320 S. S. E. 47th Avenue, Portland, Oregon, was notified to appear before Justice Stranahan at Hood River to answer the charges of building a campfire without a permit and leaving the campfire without first extinguishing the fire.

Mr. Shaylor appeared in court on the morning of July 21, and was fined \$10.00 and costs, sentenced to 10 days in the county jail. He was paroled and jail sentence will be suspended provided fine and costs are paid on or before date set by the Judge.

On July 16, Mr. W. A. Johnson, Corbett, Oregon, was found burning without a permit which is in violation of Section 42-409, Oregon Forest Laws. Mr. Johnson was notified to appear before Justice Eastman at Gresham. Justice Eastman has reported that Mr. Johnson appeared and was fined \$5.00.

On July 30th, Mr. August Brandt, Lookout fireman at Chinidere Mountain, found an abandoned campfire on the Watum Lake road at the parking area above the lake. The fire was located within 50 feet of a sign that stated "No Campfires are permitted here."

Mr. Brandt contacted the people at the lake and encountered one person that admitted having and leaving the fire. This man, Hubert Bosserman, 605 N. E. Roselawn, Portland, Oregon, signed a Form 4 MH and was notified to appear before Justice Stranahan at Hood River at 2:00 p. m., July 30th. Justice Stranahan reported that he fined Mr. Bosserman \$5.00 and \$2.50 costs.

On August 9, 1938, Phillip Leveque, Hood River, Oregon, left a campfire burning at Rainy Lake Camp. As this was in violation of Sec. 41-412, Oregon Forest Laws, he was notified to appear before Justice Stranahan at Hood River. Justice Stranahan has reported that Mr. Leveque was fined \$10.00 and \$5.00 costs.

On August 7, 1938, Gordon H. Brice, 415 S. E. 67th Ave., Portland, Oregon, and party left a campfire burning on the summit of Larch Mt. Mr. Brice was warned two different times to put out his fire but he neglected to do so. As this was in

violation of Sec. 42-412, Oregon Forest Laws, Mr. Brice, who took the responsibility for the entire party, was notified to appear before Justice Eastman at Gresham. Justice Eastman reported that Mr. Brice was fined \$10.00.
