Aid Offered In Control of Thistles

Eradication of Canadian thistle under state and county government cooperation is now possible in Hood River County. A communication from the office of County Agent A. L. Marble late last week told how the legislature has provided a limited amount of money for cooperating with counties in noxious weed control where county districts are formed. This County is a control area for Canadian Thistle and at its last meeting the County Court agreed to cooperate with the State.

Under this agreement both public and private lands may be given chemical treatment for Canadian thistle. The arrangement is as follows: Private Land, State pays for 1/2 material, County pays for 1/2 material, and the owner pays for 1/2 material. The cost to owner should not be over 12 cents per square rod.

Residents of the county are asked to report any thistle on roadsides, irrigation ditches or county or state owned land.

So far as finances permit farmers will be assisted in the order in which requests are received at the County Agent's Office. Please give exact area to be treated and location of your farm or the thistles you are reporting.

Orchard treatment for thistles is not always safe, it is pointed out, and orchardists must take chances on killing trees.

Conditions best for successful kill are: on land not recently cultivated and which will not be cultivated next spring. We have had many 100% kills on sod lands and roadsides.

The work should be done before rains if possible and the State cooperation ends December 31, 1938.

Call 6742 at once if you wish work done. No sprayers are needed, the material will be applied in the dry form.

290,000 Trout Planted in Local Streams

Rainbow trout to the number of 290,000 were being planted this week in the fishing grounds in the Hood River region. The state game commission truck has been making frequent trips from the Hood River hatchery previous to this week to streams and lakes south of Mt. Hood. The headwaters of the Clackamas, Ollalie Lake, Breitenbush and similar grounds have been stocked from the local hatchery.

Eastern Brook trout were placed in August and the present planting season is seeing the game Rainbow trout going into the streams. Plantings were scheduled as follows:

Lost Lake, 60,000.
Mosier Creek, 20,000.
Phelps Creek, south of Belmons, 20,000.

Indian Creek, south of Rockford store, 20,000.
Odell Creek, Duke's Valley crossing, 20,000.

Neal Creek, 20,000.
Tony Creek, 20,000.
Middle Fork Hood River, west of Parkdale, 40,000.

East Fork Hood River, on Loop Highway near Sherwood camp, 40,000.

The Rainbows are three inches in length, and according to Alva Day, of the Hood River County Game Protective Association, they should be from six to seven inches long next year.

New concrete pools at the Hood

River Hatchery, constructed a year ago, to replace the former earthen pools, have enabled the local hatchery to handle a great number of fish with a great deal of efficiency and a minimum of loss.

Women Voters Hear Miss Florence Kirlin

Miss Florence Kirlin, congressional secretary of the national League of Women Voters, addressed an interested audience Thursday evening, September 22, at Library Hall. She gave a fascinating account of the work done in Washington to promote legislation which the League favors, with many sidelights drawn from her close personal experience with congressional work.

Miss Kirlin's talk was the first of the series of meetings planned by League groups, as announced by Mrs. MacMaster Halsted, president of the Hood River League. "Know Your County" will be the subject studied by local groups, with Mrs. Roderick McRae in charge of the county program. Mrs. John Cooper is in charge of the work in Parkdale, and Mrs. C. A. Seegar at Odell.

completed, can be seen from Hood River, it was said, and when the sign is completed, reported the firemen, it will be easily visible and read from the Columbia River Highway.

Each letter is over 40 feet long by 24 feet wide, made exclusively of two-by-fours. Over 3200 feet of lumber will be used, and over eleven gallons of white paint.

The work was started by the firemen, backed by business houses of the town, over a month ago.

The most difficult part of the work is the long haul to get lumber to the site of the structure. No road leads to the sign from the canyon road, and the lumber has to be packed to the construction work.
