UTILITY DISTRICT LAW (Continued from Page One)

There is every indication that the greater portion of the electric energy to be produced at Bonneville will ultimately be needed to satisfy the requirements of public bodies and co-operatives. Section 5 (a) of that Act provides "... the administrator may cancel ... (private utility's) contract ... if it is likely to be needed to satisfy the requirements of said public bodies ..."

In 1930 the voters adopted an amendment to the constitution of Oregon, providing for the organization of people's utility districts. In 1931 the Oregon legislature enacted a people's utility district law (Tit. LVI, Ch. 34, Ore. Code, 1935 Supp.). In 1930, the Washington voters, by initiative enacted a law authorizing the establishment and operation of public utility districts to distribute electric energy in the State of Washington (Tit. 84, Ch. 3, Rem. Rev. Stat.). The Washington public utility law is the most satisfactory law of its kind in the United States. Under this law, eighteen public utility districts have been organized in the State of Washington and in the November general election, proposals to form at least ten more public utility districts will be voted upon in Washington. In Oregon only three people's utility districts have been organized. The fact that eighteen utility districts have been organized in Washington, while only three have been organized in Oregon, is largely due to the existing Oregon People's Utility Law, which is unsatisfactory. In this connection, it is pertinent to compare the Oregon law with the Washington law.

Organization of Districts. In Oregon preliminary petitions for the organization of a proposed district, signed by voters, or executed pursuant to a resolution of a legislative body of the city or town, are filed with the State Hydroelectric Commission. The commission then holds a hearing and reports on the advisability of creating the district. Thereafter, final petitions may be filed with the commission, whereupon the commission causes an election to be held to determine whether or not the district shall be formed.

The requirement of the Oregon statute that two sets of petitions be filed with the State Hydroelectric Commission, with its attendant danger of technical defects, has proven very cumbersome in practice. The Oregon statute should be amended so as to follow the Washington procedure, requiring but one set of petitions. The fact that the Oregon law does not permit a utility district to

be organized, the territorial limits of which are co-extensive with the territorial limits of a county, by means of a resolution of the county commissioners submitting the matter to the voters, as may be done in Washington, has proven a distinct handicap and the Oregon law should be amended so as to authorize this procedure.
