NOTICE OF SALE OF STATE LAND

NOTICE is hereby given that the State Land Board of the State of Oregon will receive sealed bids in its office in the Capitol Building, Salem, Oregon, up to 10:00 o'clock a. m., October 31, 1938, for all the State's interest in tide and overflow lands hereinafter described, giving, however, the owner or owners of any lands abutting or fronting thereon, the preference right to purchase said lands at the highest price offered, provided such offer is made in good faith, also with the understanding that the purchaser is to pay the expense of advertising and survey of the tract, in addition to the amount bid.

Said lands are situated in Hood River County, Oregon, and are particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the one-quarter section corner on the west line of Section 31, T. 3 N. R. 10 E. of W.
