Purchases for Transmission Over 2 Million

The Bonneville Project has contracted to purchase to date \$2,789,941.23 in transmission cable, towers, insulators, supplies, and equipment. Announcement of these figures was made by Administrator J. D. Ross. Expenditures either made or under contract are distributed as follows:

Towers	\$1,280,974.50
Conductors	1,194,267.96
Miscellaneous	88,429.43
Insulators	207,279.44
Total	\$2,780,941.23

Delivery of much of this material must be started before December 1, and completed within designated limits during the immediate months to come.

All of the cable for the Bonneville transmission system is under contract with the exception of that for the line from Vancouver to Salem, and from Salem to Eugene, said Administrator Ross. Bids for the Vancouver-Salem line have been received and are being studied. Bids for the Salem-Eugene line are yet to be invited.

Among the major items for which bids will be invited to complete the assemblage of materials necessary for the Bonneville network, said Administrator Ross, will be poles for the lines from Bonneville to The Dalles, Vancouver to Eugene, and Kelso to Aberdeen.

Other large contracts to be awarded, said Administrator Ross, will be for a huge tower on Bradford Island and lesser towers there as well as towers for the Columbia River crossing near Vancouver and on the Willamette River. "I am pleased with the engineering progress picture," said Administrator Ross. "Our program is well under way. We expect to make some long strides yet this year and move steadily and rapidly in 1939. Our long range schedule calls for completion of this transmission network in 1940. We will make it."

Recipes . . .

Cinnamon Apples
1 cup granulated sugar; 1 cup water; 1 cup red cinnamon candies; 1 cup cottage cheese; 5 small apples; 1/2 cup chopped walnuts; 2 tbsps. mayonnaise; lettuce. Heat sugar, water, and cinnamon candies in saucepan over low flame until candy is dissolved. Pare and core apples, place in syrup, cover and cook very slowly until tender but not broken. The apples should be bright red. Turn once during cooking. Remove carefully from syrup and chill. Fill centers with cheese, walnut meats and mayonnaise combined. Serve on lettuce.

STOLEN CAR RECOVERED
