Dealers Say Radio Show Is Best Ever

Hood River County residents may take the word of local radio dealers for it, the 1939 Radio Show which is scheduled at the Columbia Gorge Hotel, Monday, Oct. 31, is going to be a record-breaker, both in exhibits and in entertainment. Doors are scheduled to open at 8 p. m.

More dealers will display more new model sets, there will be more educational exhibits and the Trail Blazers, famous NBC-KGW musical troupe, will fill the entertainment part of this great free show to overflowing.

According to Roderic McRae, district manager for Pacific Power and Light Company, which is cooperating with local dealers in sponsoring the show, one of the feature educational exhibits will be that demonstrating common causes of radio interference and how to cure them.

Every dealer participating in the show will have a special booth in which to display a complete line of 1939 models of the radio sets and accessories which he sells. Each booth will be tastefully decorated and will be lighted by sightsaving I.E.S. lamps.

Straight from stations KGW-KEX and the National Broadcasting System come the Trail Blazers, to furnish the entertainment and music. They will present each program in the form of a broadcast, complete in every detail, except that it won't go on the air. Radiocasts are scheduled at four in the afternoon and again at eight and nine o'clock in the evening. Each program will consist of vocal and instrumental solos, ensembles and novelty musical numbers.

Every one of the Trail Blazers plays a number of instruments and more than twenty different instruments are being brought here for the show. Some of them are as weird and wonderful in appearance as the eccentric costumes of the troupe.

Heading the Trail Blazers and master of ceremonies for the radiocasts, is Clarence (Toley) Tolman, prominent artist of stage, musical comedy, concert, and radio. He has sung leading roles in Lee Shubert's Broadway productions, and has been co-featured in appearances with such celebrities as Eddie Dowling, Winnie Lightner, Tom Patricola, Ann Pennington, Moran and Mack, Wheeler and Woolsey, Stanley Lupino, Vincent Lopez, Al Goodman, and Al Jolson. One of the outstanding radio personalities of the Pacific Coast, he has been featured over the NBC network. He is heard currently over KGW, Portland, in "Covered Wagon Days," and "Toley in 'Toley and Glenn."

"Poke Pickens," that lovable, stuttering character of "Covered Wagon Days," heard on KEX, is John Nash. His specialty as part of the Trail Blazers is playing stringed instruments, which include the electric steel and Spanish guitars, banjos, and mandolin.

Ralph "Snoose" Hamilton, the featured artist of the group, actually makes the piano talk, and in addition to this, he is also a master of the pipe organ, accordion and violin. A bit of biography tells us Mr. Hamilton is a graduate of the Minneapolis Conservatory of Music, he served as musical director of RKO a number of years ago, was a featured organist at the Paramount Theater in Portland.

No musical group is complete without the master violinist, and in this role Charles "Johnny" Johnson is the impresario. Although most of his Trail Blazer selections are far removed from symphonic, his versatility is proved by the fact he has

been a first violinist in the Portland Symphony Orchestra. James "Jake" Schmidt, master of guitar and banjo, rounds out this group of entertainers, and his history, as the others, includes many appearances on the radio, in vaudeville, and with well-known dance bands.

CCC Boys Moved To Parkdale Station

The boundary CCC camp of 22 boys have been moved to Parkdale Forest Station, who with the regular men, composed of 13 guards, etc., and 6 E. R. A. men combine a maintenance crew. 1. Battery condition test. Add distilled water, clean battery terminals, inspect and clean battery cables.
2. Test starting motor starter switch; tighten all starter connections.
3. Clean generator armature; sand in armature brushes; tighten all generator connections; adjust belt tension.
4. Check alignment and operation of all lights; tighten connections; check all light switches.
5. Inspect and tighten all electrical connections at ignition switch, fuse block, etc.
6. Tune engine, including cleaning and adjusting spark plugs and distributor. Inspect high tension wires; clean gasoline lines, drain carburetor, plow out jets, check fuel level and adjust throttle for proper engine idle and set accelerator control rod to "winter" position. Drain and check fuel pump.
7. Tighten cylinder heads, intake and exhaust manifolds.
8. Completely lubricate chassis. Will make for easier riding and insure against unnecessary wear.
9. Change engine oil to winter grade. This assures proper lubrication, economy and easy starting.
10. Drain and flush out transmission and rear axle and refill with winter lubricants. This will afford proper protection to the moving parts and insure easy shifting.
11. Check cooling system for leaks, replace hose, etc., if required. Drain out all water, flush to remove all dirt and grease.
12. Add Ford Anti-Freeze to cooling system.
13. Check windshield wiper operation and blade condition. Includes corrections in vacuum line if required.
14. Adjust clutch pedal.
