Bids Asked On First Dredging Link

Whether the dredging of the Columbia between Vancouver and Bonneville will be attempted in various units, after the installment-buying fashion of the American public, has not been learned. At any rate Camas, Wash., is assured of being the furthest inland seaport. Major Theron D. Weaver, Bonneville district engineer, Friday called for bids for dredging the section of the Vancouver-The Dalles ship channel between Vancouver and Camas.

Approximately 1,740,000 cubic yards of silt and sand will be dredged from the river bed to provide a 15-foot depth at low water. During a 90-day period in the average year when water is higher ships of greater depth will be able to use the channel when it is completed.

The Charles L. Wheeler, Jr., first ocean-going vessel to make the trip to The Dalles through the lock at Bonneville, draws 14 feet.

The initial program also calls for construction of 30 pile dikes to prevent shoaling between Vancouver and Multnomah falls.

The channel will be completed to a 27-foot depth next year if money is appropriated by congress for that purpose.

Household Hints

Rake all leaves in the corner of your garden. Spread in layers, cover each layer with nitrate of soda, play hose on leaves until thoroughly wet. Continue to pile up in layers, keeping well watered until the winter snows fall on them and you will have good leaf mold in the spring.

Steaming is a good way to cook vegetables because it reduces the loss of minerals and vitamins.

Meringue may be made on waxed paper and placed on top of the pudding after it has been put into the sherbet glasses.

Do not throw away lumpy sugar. It will make a simple syrup good for sweetening if put in water and heated.

Leftover onions and cabbage should never be put away in the refrigerator unless they are in a covered dish.

Recipes . . .

Tomato Juice Ring

4 cups tomato juice, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup chopped sweet pickles, 2 tablespoons chopped onion, 4 tablespoons gelatin, 1 cup cold water. Soak gelatin in cup of cold water until thick and smooth, place mixture in top of double boiler and heat until dissolved. Add the gelatin mixture to the tomato juice, to which has been added the chopped pickles and onion. Pour into a rinsed ring mold and chill until firm. Unmold and serve with center filled with a salad.

NEW RIVER RULING

A new ruling, which will apply to water travel on the Columbia was announced last week by Secretary of War Henry H. Woodring through government engineers, pertaining to lights to be displayed on pipe lines. It follows:

Pipe lines attached to dredges, and either floating or supported on trestles, shall display by night one row of amber lights not less than 8 feet nor more than 12 feet above the water. There shall also be displayed on the shore or discharge end of the line 2 red lights, 3 feet apart, in a vertical line with the lower light at least 8 feet above the water, and if the line is to be open at night for the passage of vessels, a similar arrangement of lights shall be displayed on each side of the opening.

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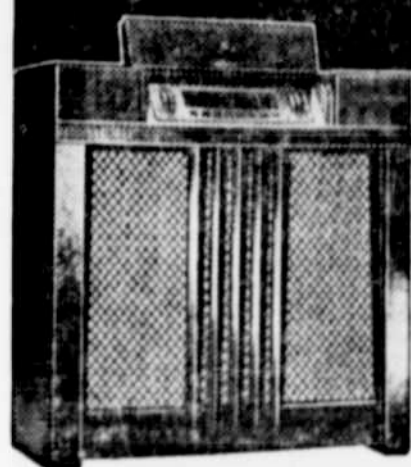
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
