The board of port commissioners at The Dalles will receive bids until 11 a. m. on November 15 for the construction of an insulated storage room in an existing transit shed and a barge landing at the river terminal, the regional office of the Public Works Administration announced.

Plans were drawn by Charles Hageman, engineer, of The Dalles. Total cost will be approximately \$8,520. A PWA grant of \$3,837 has been allotted for the project.
