BOOK POSTAGE RATE LOWER

President Roosevelt ordered the domestic postage on books reduced to 1 1/2 cents a pound last week, asserting he hoped this would stimulate "cultural growth, education and development of the American people." At present books come under parcel post rates which range from 7 cents a pound upward, depending upon the zone. The new rate, effective November 1 to June 30, 1939, is the same, irrespective of the destination point.

SCHOOL INDEBTEDNESS LOWER

From 1936 to 1938 Hood River County decreased its school indebtedness \$21,486.59, according to figures from State Treasurer Holman. The net debt in 1936 was \$116,347.32; in 1938, \$94,860.83.

The local decrease was instrumental in cutting down the total state indebtedness for a like period to a total decrease of \$2,518,057.30.

CONTRACTORS ASK EXTENSION

A request for extension of the time for completion of the Hood River city street improvement was requested from the city council Monday night by Babler Brothers, contractors. The original contract called for completion of the improvements in four months' time. The contractors pointed out that weather conditions would hinder the laying of oil-bound macadam in winter months, and asked that their contract

be extended until August 1, 1939. The council voted the extension, subject to the approval of PWA officials and the bonding company backing the contractors.

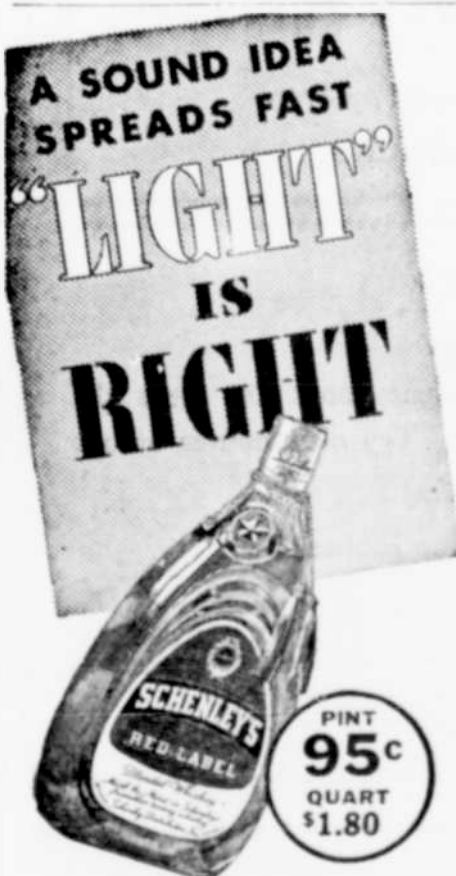
