One pint of warm boiled hominy Add one pint of milk (or water), one pint of flour. Beat two or three eggs and stir into batter with a little salt Fry as other griddlecakes. They are delicious.

***************************** Household Hints

Pie Points

Before you roll out your pie dough to fit it into pie pans, chill the dough thoroughly. Doing so makes it easier to handle. Never over chill pastry. It will crack when rolled and is then difficult to handle. Roll out just enough dough for one pie crust at a time. Work quickly and roll from the center to the outside. Keep shape as round as possible. Pricking pie crusts to prevent them from blistering during baking must be a thorough job. Sides and bottom of crust should be pricked at inch intervals. Kitchen scissors are handy to use when trimming edges from pie before baking.


