

Lumber Barge Almost Stranded

A barge, loaded with 80,000 feet of lumber experienced some difficulty in navigating into deep water last Friday, when the Jaymar Lumber Company made a shipment to the Morrison-Knudsen company for their contract in building piling between Dodson and Bonneville. The work is a part of the dredging operations of the river below Bonneville Dam.

Loading of the lumber onto a barge was carried on at the Lofts landing on Morrison's Point. A rapid drop in the river level, due to opening gates in the dam, had made the channel in Hood River harbor shallow. There was only a three-foot draft and the barge was resting on the bottom of the river. With considerable chugging, the tug was able to tow the barge to deeper water.

Jaymar Company officials are anticipating difficulty in shipping more of the lumber in their Morrison-Knudsen contract by water after the river is lowered an additional five feet on February 6.

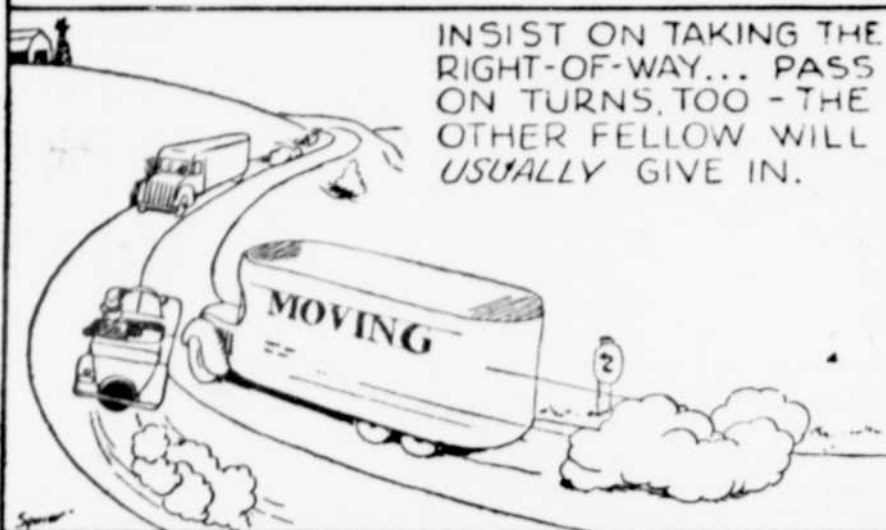

Public Invited to See Trout Lay Eggs

Record-breaking trout are continuing to lay eggs at the Hood River Hatchery, according to Alva Day, secretary of the Hood River County Game Protective Association, who was at the hatchery Sunday to assist in the work of taking the eggs from spawning trout. On Sunday, two weeks ago, a total of 21,000 eggs was taken from nine Rainbows; on Sunday of last week, 11,000 trout yielded 19,800 eggs; and last Sunday totals of 27,000 eggs were laid by 12 trout. The rainbows being spawned are three- to four-years old.

The artificial spawning operations will be continued next Sunday. Sportsmen or anyone interested is invited to be at the hatchery at 3 o'clock to see how the eggs are taken and handled.

COUNTY COMMISSIONERS STUDY BAD ROADS

Members of the county court, accompanied by Roadmaster Oscar Mogren, Monday inspected all the principal county roads for their own enlightenment. Tucker Road, south of the end of the pavement, was observed to be in a bad state of repairs, and decision was made to rebuild the bridge across the river at Dee, where timbers were ascertained to be weak. Concrete for pillars was poured on this bridge two years ago, and will be

used in rebuilding the structure. Members of the court yesterday conferred with State Highway officials and WPA executives in Portland.

INCOME TAX ADVISOR TO STOP IN HOOD RIVER

A communication received here from the State Tax Commission of Oregon recently brought the announcement that an income tax auditor will be in Hood River February 8 and 9 between the hours of 8 a. m. and 5 p. m. for the purpose of assisting income taxpayers in preparing their 1938 state income, intangibles, and excise tax returns.

Every resident of Oregon with income from all sources amounting to \$1,500.00 or more (or \$800.00 if from intangibles) must file a state income tax return with this office. Also every single person (or married and not living with husband or wife) with income of \$800.00 (or \$500.00 if from intangibles) must file a state income tax return with this office.

Every partnership and every corporation authorized to do, or doing business in Oregon (not

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specifically exempt,) must file a return.

Returns for the calendar year 1938 must be filed on or before April 1, 1939, to avoid the delinquency charges provided by law.

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
