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Recipes . . .

Banana Muffins

1 1/2 cups flour, 2 tsp. baking powder, 1/2 tsp. soda; 1/2 tsp. grated orange rind, 1/2 tsp. salt, 1/2 cup brown sugar, 1 egg beaten; 1 cup mashed bananas, 2 tbsp. sour cream, 3 tbsps. fat melted; mix ingredients and half-fill greased muffin pans. Bake 20 min. in moderate oven. If sour cream is not available, put 1/2 tbsp. vinegar in 1 1/2 tbsps. sweet cream. After one minute it will be sour. You can add 1/2 cup broken nuts to muffins.
