bonds to any successful bidder therefore."

Attorneys Wyers and Gavin are now perfecting their appeals and hope that everything will work out so that they will be able to argue the case before the Supreme Court sometime in May. As soon as the case is filed it is expected that they will ask for advancement on the court calendar of this case due to the tremendous public interest in its outcome.

The filing of the notice of appeal is being prepared together with the preparation of the bond to go with it. The abstract of record is in the hands of the printers and the briefs are being prepared.

The City of Cascade Locks is taking the position that the revenue certificates to be issued in the financing of the purchase of the private utility properties are not in the strictest sense of the word "Bonds" and therefore should not come under the Oregon Statute that states that all "Bonds" should be offered at public sale. The city maintains that these certificates are just promises to pay out of the income of the system and have no general obligation status whatsoever and therefore should not be considered as "Bonds."

RECIPE**Chocolate Waffles**

2 cups sifted flour, 4 tsp. baking powder, 1 tsp. salt, 3 tsp. sugar, 2 egg yolks, 4 tbsp. melted shortening, 1 1/2 cups milk, 1 square melted chocolate, 1 tsp. maple extract and 2 egg whites. Sift flour, baking powder, salt and sugar. Beat egg yolks, add milk and mix with dry ingredients. Add shortening, chocolate and extract. Beat well. Fold in egg whites stiffly beaten. Bake on hot waffle iron and serve with syrup.
