

FOUR **Fire Destroys** 2 Warehouses; Loss, \$200,000

Fire of undetermined origin broke out in the Kelly Brothers' warehouse in Hood River at 3:30 Saturday morning, and before the ravishing flames had been extinguished, the Kelly Warehouse and the "Big 7" plant of the Apple Growers Association, which adjoins. it on the east, were completely destroyed.

By noon the fire was under control and the Hood River Volunteer Fire Department, under the direction of Fire Chief John Volstorff, had prevented the flames from spreading to the AGA cider and vinegar factory, just east of the "Big 7" plant.

Paisley has been a textile town for more than 200 years, recalls a writer in the Cleveland Plain Dealer, and some of its old streets commemorate in quaint names the fact that the industry has long been domiciled there-there are Lawn, Gauze, Incle, Cotton, Silk, Thread and Shuttle streets.

adopted during the early stages of development of the project are not fully adquate for the purpose of meeting the requirements of prospective purchasers and at the same time carrying out the above policies expressed by Congress. It has therefore been advisable to prepare at this time a new set of rate schdules to supplement those

which are now in effect. "It is thought that the new schedules provide a more flexible and appropriate basis on which to dispose of Bonneville power, and one which will more adequately meet the needs of both publicly and privately owned purchasers."

For the past two weeks Barry Dibble, Assistant Bonneville Administrator, has been conferring with Federal Power Commission officials regarding the proposed schedules. Assisting him has been Adrian S. Fisher, special counsel for the project. James Lawrence
