Mrs. Harry Dee Ross and son, Bobby, and Mr. and Mrs. George Miller were Hood River visitors Monday.

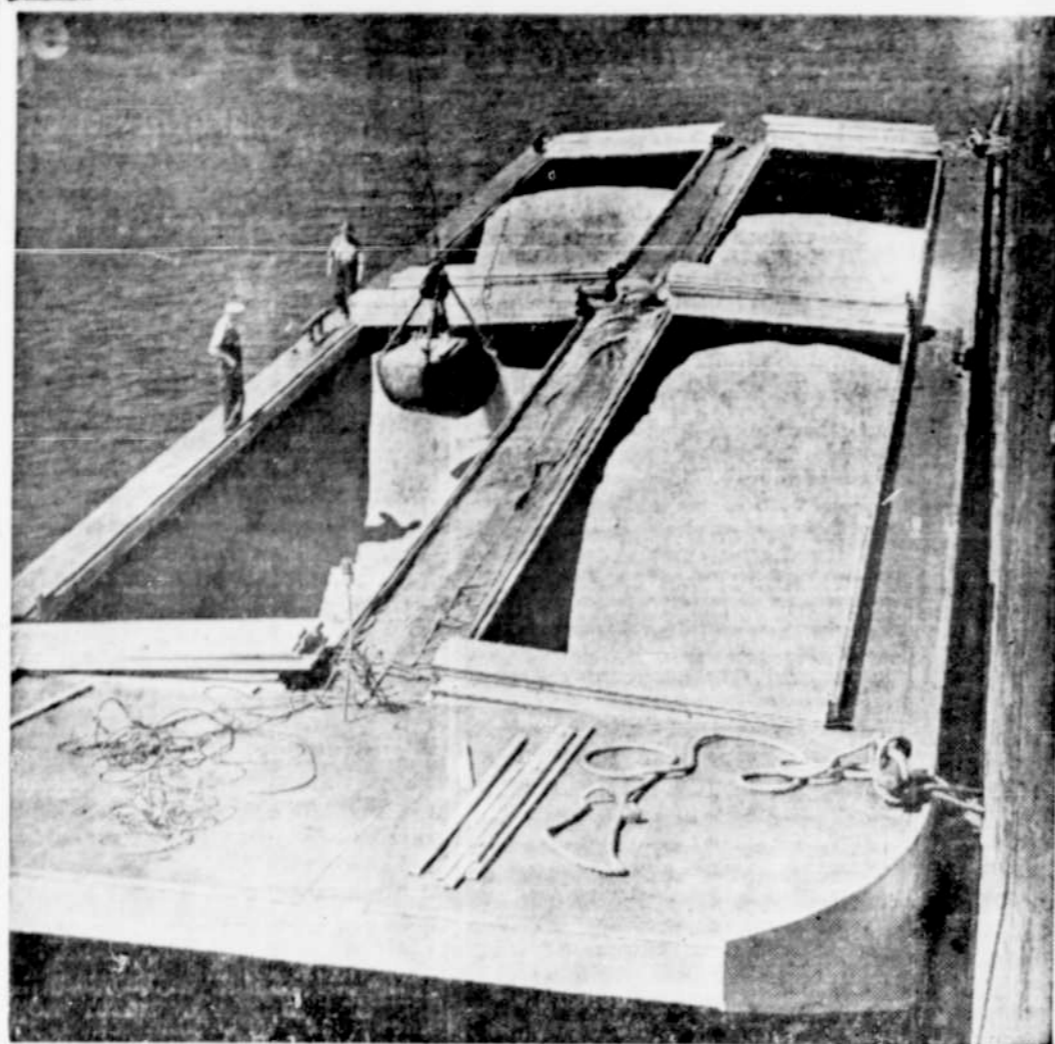
Robert Foote of Portland was visiting his parents, Mr. and Mrs. A. W. Foote last Wednesday.
