### Recipes . . .

#### Pie Crust

2 1/2 cups sifted flour; 1 tsp. salt; 3/4 cup shortening; 5 tbsps. cold water (approx.). Sift flour and salt together. Add half shortening to flour. Cut in with pastry blender or two knives until mixture looks like meal. Add remaining shortening and continue cutting until particles are size of navy beans. Sprinkle water, 1 tbsp at a time, over mixture. With a fork, work lightly together until all particles are moistened and in small lumps. Add just enough water to moisten. Press dampened particles together into a ball. Do not handle dough any more than necessary. Makes one 2-crust, 9-inch pie. Helpful hints: Never turn dough while rolling. Fit dough into pie plate and let relax a few minutes before filling.

### Household Hints

The next time you serve strawberry shortcake, add small pieces of marshmallows to the crushed berries. Let stand and use on

shortcake. They make the strawberries go farther and sweeten the mixture at the same time, for no sugar is needed.

Egg yolks not used in cooking may be kept a few days by covering them with little water or milk and placing in refrigerator. You can drop them in hot water and cook gently until hard. These later will be good for garnishing either chopped or pressed through sieve. Also is good added to fish sauce.

When you are sewing or embroidering, tie a piece of tape or a ribbon on your scissors and hang them around your neck. Scissors are usually lost or sliding away from you just when you need them.

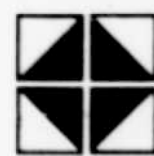
