Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Clark, members of the State Highway paint crew, are making their home in the Locks for a few weeks while the maintenance shed is being painted.

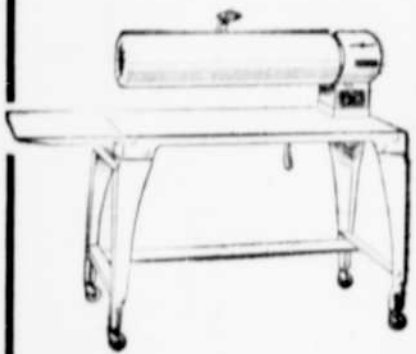

entire needs, at this time, of the Hood River and Wasco P. U. D.s. Frank A. Banks, acting administrator of the Bonneville project, announced that the agency will be ready to deliver power as soon as the Wasco and Hood River districts obtain distribution facilities.

Bids to Be Asked
Bids for construction of a 110,000-volt line through both P. U. D.s to The Dalles will be asked in less than 30 days, Banks said, and the line will be completed not later than June 30, 1940.

Banks promised aid to Wasco county in "solving their engineering and accounting problems."

The Wasco county P. U. D., strongest in population and industries yet formed in Oregon, was approved in The Dalles by a vote of 1086 to 802, but the smaller towns of Dufur and Mosier voted to stay out of the district, 24 Yes and 38 No, and 10 Yes and 93 No, respectively.

Directors elected to serve until January 1, 1941, are C. E. Foster, W. J. Seufert, A. W. Manchester, and Charles Rath, all business men of The Dalles, and Roy Johnson, farmer.

people's utility district, Wasco County is taking proper steps to receive the full benefit of low-cost Bonneville power for homes, farms and industry."

Banks pointed out that formation of the Wasco district provides public agencies from the dam to the eastern end of the line. Cascade Locks' city system already is receiving Bonneville power, and Hood River people's utility district has been validated by the State Hydroelectric Commission. Both

Wasco and Hood River Counties now are served by the Pacific Power & Light Company. Electric rates are \$4.47 for 100 kilowatt-hours in rural homes and \$3.90 in the city.

will run northeast to Grand Coulee, passing through Skamania, Klickitat, Yakima, Kittitas, Chelan, Douglas and Lincoln counties, a distance of 239 miles.

The Vancouver-Aberdeen line, starting at Vancouver, runs northwest to Aberdeen, passing through Clark, Cowlitz, Lewis, Wahkiakum, Pacific and Grays Harbor counties, an approximate distance of 127 miles.

The Kelso-Cathlamet line, starting at Kelso, runs northwest through Cowlitz and Wahkiakum counties, about 30 miles, and the Vancouver-Eugene line starts at Vancouver, running south to the Columbia river, about 2.77 miles.

The department of the interior, in sponsoring this project proposal, has pledged \$486,800 to purchase materials and supplies and has asked the WPA for allocations of \$1,988,834 to cover labor costs.
