PNEUMONIA EXPLAINED.

It is generally supposed that pneumonia is due to the accidental penetration of specific microbes into the system, but the observations of M. Jaccoud, a French student of the subject, show that the disease really results from the development under favorable conditions of microbic germs permanently present in the system. A chief condition of such development is a sudden chill, which explains the frequent coincidence of lung affections with abrupt changes of temperature.

A DEVELOPING ART.

Probably no application of science is advancing more rapidly than photography. Among recent appliances are a detective camera in the form of a watch, with a charm to hold a supply of miniature dry-plates, and a telescopic camera in which distant objects are brought near by telescopic aid and photographed. Modern dry plates have made the camera quite available at night, and exquisite pictures are now taken by moonlight and even by starlight.

A CURIOUS DISCOVERY.

In the tartar of teeth from skeletons of the stone age, Mr. Charters White, of the Odontological society of Great Britain, has found specimens of the food eaten by our prehistoric ancestors 3,000 years or more ago. The fragments identified include portions of corn husks, spiral vessels from vegetables, starch husks, fruit cells, the point of a fish's tooth, and bits of wool, feathers and cartilage.

SURGICAL PROGRESS.

At two of the leading hospitals of Paris the death-rate from amputations of all kinds has fallen from 50 per cent. in 1883 to about 15 per cent. at present.

A couplet such as either of these, in bold, strong, fantastic lettering, can be painted on the stone or bricks, or a strip of artist's canvas may be tinted and form the background. The strip should be tacked in place before it is painted. It can, of course, be removed later, should one wish to make a change. -Jenny June, in The American Magazine for December.
