The new Chinese treaty, which was made public the other day, provides that for the period of of the exchange of ratifications, the coming of Chinese laborers to the United States is prohibited. This does not apply to the Chinese laborer who has a lawful wife, child or parent in the United States; or property therein to the value of a amount due him.

Chinese officials, teachers, students, co Examiner. merchants and travelers for curiosity and pleasure remain undisturbed. Chinese laborers shall have for the protection of their persons and property all the rights given by the laws of the United States, except the right to become notice. naturalized citizens.

It is agreed in the treaty to pay \$275,619 as full indemnity for all losses sustained by Chinese subjects who have been victims of injury in person and property at the hands of wicked and lawless men.

If, within six months before expiration of the period of twenty years, neither government formally gives notice to the other of its termination, the treaty shall remain in force another period of twenty years.




