WHAT WE WANT.  
It is not necessary that I should inform you that the liquor traffic is a "monster" evil—all this is well understood. But who is responsible for this traffic? Who? Every man who does not realize his greatest privilege as an American citizen and cast his vote where it will aid in overthrowing this curse. Every woman who allows a high remark on this subject to pass her lips, or who does not use all her influence against this evil, until the time shall come when she may add to speech and influence the mightiest of all weapons, the ballot. The sixth commandment says, "Thou shalt not kill," but the powers that be say, "You may kill if you use poison and pay a license fee so that the government may derive a revenue from the sixty-thousand murders committed by rum every year in this country." Who sustains the government in this business? The people. They fold their hands and tell you that God will sweep away the plague in his own good time. But God will not without agencies, and he will hold every one responsible even though they claim that their sympathies are all alright. We have in America 80,000 churches and for each one of the 80,000 churches there are four grog-shops, and for each of the 90,000 ministers there are six bartenders. According to the estimate there are 320,000 grog-shops and 540,000 persons supporting themselves by selling poison which not only kills the body but destroys the soul. We have 90,000 ministers preaching the "glad tidings of salvation," and 540,000 bartenders dealing out damnation. But in the Bible we are told that "one shall chase a thousand and two put ten-thousand to flight." The Christian church has a membership of sixteen millions, one-fourth of these are legal voters. How quickly they might rid our land of this blight by calling to their aid the immense number of workers outside of the church; then we should have a majority, all that is needed to annihilate the rum power. Voters, liquor manufacturers, liquor sellers are alke responsible for this crime and its results. We want this traffic banished by the people, but we do not want any half way policy; we do not want any soothing of the conscience; any vain twaddle about regulation; any respectability tendered the rum business; any choosing between "two evils," when we have an alternative; but we do want the complete annihilation of the rum fiend.—U.
