The *Irish World*, which supported Blaine four years ago, and the editor of which was in the Chicago convention, working for Blaine's nomination, has come out for Cleveland, alleging as its excuse for a change of base, Harrison's Chinese and labor record. It publishes the names of fourteen labor organs which supported Blaine four years ago, that have also come out for Cleveland.

The following is a part of Harrison's Chinese record; Congressional Globe, vol 13, p 3,411, 1882:

The Page bill of 1882, the present restriction act, contained the following provision:

That hereafter no state court or court of the United States shall admit Chinese to citizenship, and all laws in conflict with this are hereby repealed.

Mr. Edmunds moved to strike out that section and substitute the following:

Nothing in this act shall be construed to change the existing naturalization laws so as to admit Chinese to citizenship.

The effect of that would have been to leave the naturalization laws as they were. Under those laws eastern judges were naturalizing Chinamen all the time. Every one of those Chinamen had, and has now, the right to come to Oregon with his papers and vote. The amendment was recognized on all sides as a flank movement to defeat legislation forbidding Chinese naturalization. The six Pacific coast senators voted solidly against it. The pro-Chinese contingent, Hawley, Dawes, Harrison and the rest, voted solidly in its favor.
