NOTES.

(From the National W. C. T. U. Bulletin.) Texas is the first of the southern states to declare for woman suffrage through its Womens' Christian Temperance Union, which she did at the recent state convention.

Major George A. Hilton lately closed a series of meetings at Piqua, Ohio, where 129 new members were added to the W. C. T. U.

Mr. John Jones, relieving officer, Stepney, England, states that of 7,000 applicants for relief of whose cases he has taken notes, not one per cent. had been total abstainers.

A most commendable philanthropy has been inaugurated by Mrs. Dr. Smith, of Newark, New Jersey, who has contributed \$12,000 for the purpose of constructing a playhouse for the use of children in that city, who have no place but the streets to play in.

The United Kingdom Band of Hope Union has decided to memorialize Christian churches against the use of fermented wine at the Lord's table. Their plea is that it is dangerous to members of the Band of Hope who join churches.

The committee of Lincoln, Nebraska, W. C. T. U., having charge of the department of narcotics, have secured through the city council an ordinance, passed unanimously, prohibiting the sale of tobacco to children under fifteen years of age.

Sir. A. B. Walker, of Liverpool, a brewer, has offered to build a cathedral in that city at a cost of \$1,250,000. Decided objection is made by some of the religious papers to the acceptance of the gift, as he is not only a brewer, but is also owner of a large number of drinking places in Liverpool. They say the money he would put into the cathedral is "blood money" and ought not to be accepted.

Col. Sidney D. Maxwell, superintendent of the Cincinnati Chamber of Commerce, in his annual report, recently made, says the consumption of beer for the year ending August 31, 1887, in Cincinnati, Covington and Newport aggregated 726,112 barrels of 290,444,800 glasses. In commenting upon this report the Liquor Dealer, a saloon organ, speaks as follows: "At five cents per glass the total amount therefore paid over the counter was the enormous sum of \$14,522,240. Add to this the sum paid for vinous and distilled liquors and the total becomes appalling." Even the advocates of the saloon are "appalled" at the rapid increase of the liquor traffic.

The democrats of Indianapolis, Harrison's own home, had a magnificent ratification recently. There were 5,000 men in line. Gov. Gray and ex-Senator McDonald made speeches. The following were some of the transparencies:
