THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE.

The annual message of the president, which we present to our readers to-day, while quite long is well worth reading.

There is nothing startling in the document and nothing than can in any view be termed brilliant. In spite of the opposition of Senator Peck and others in congress, the president still adheres to his recommendations of the suspension of the compulsory coinage of silver;

The president says that the existing revenue laws bring too much money into the treasury and that duties on imports should be reduced in order to reduce the surplus funds. Further along we are told that "The defenseless condition of our sea coast and land frontier is perfectly palpable,"

Public Printer Benedict has notified the treasury department that an immediate appropriation of \$85,000 is needed to prevent suspension of work in the government printing office on December 15th,

On account of the many subjects touched upon and the manifold interests involved in the discussion of some of them the message cannot be reviewed in full. Suffice it to say that the document will compare favorably with its predecessors.

The case of W. W. Saunders, convicted of the murder of Chas. Campbell in Albany, was taken up in the supreme court at 9 o'clock yesterday morning, on an appeal from Linn county.

Oregon's senator, John H. Mitchell is on time regarding Oregon's interests, and has introduced in the senate resolutions requesting the secretary of war to furnish the senate with full information regarding the change of United States engineers in charge of the construction of the river and harbor improvements in Oregon at the mouth of the Columbia river,

NOTES AND NEWS.

Joseph W. Harper, United States consul to Munich, died there Tuesday, December 8.

Heavy gales are reported throughout England and Ireland. Communication by telegraph is very much interfered with.

Last spring Mr. Nimrod Payne, of Albany, sent thirty-two head of horses to the Burnt river country near Huntington, in eastern Oregon. A few days ago the entire band died from eating poison laurel. Mr. Payne's loss is \$8,300.

The Wisconsin Central Railroad company has decided to increase the pay of the porters and waiters employed on its sleeping and dining cars to an amount which will give them ample compensation for their work, and prohibits them from receiving "tips" from passengers.

In the Goldenson case, San Francisco Tuesday, the motion for a change of venue was denied. The petition for a commission to take testimony in Russia relating to his alleged insane relatives was granted. The case was then continued until February 14. There is much dissatisfaction expressed at the many delays.

A man named Cattle was killed last Friday morning at Zion, sixteen miles east of Oregon City, by a man named Ranstrickler. All that could be learned of the affair was that some land was being surveyed, when a dispute arose and Ranstrickler seized an ax and split Cattle's head open, killing him almost instantly.

East Oregonian: "An effort is being made by the friends of Samuel Doane to have him pardoned out of the penitentiary. It will be remembered that Doane killed his brother-in-law, Albert White, in Pendleton, three years ago, by shooting him in the head with a pistol. Doane was tried and sentenced to the penitentiary for life." Let him stay there.

Representative republicans from all parts of the state met at Indianapolis, Wednesday, and formed a permanent campaign club under the name of Lincoln League. S. N. Houston, chairman of the state central committee, was elected president. Clubs are to be formed in all parts of the state, and delegates will be sent from each to the annual league meetings. The idea is to educate the young and to properly influence the young men so that they may deposit their first ballots in the interests of republican principles.

Public Printer Benedict has notified the treasury department that an immediate appropriation of \$85,000 is needed to prevent suspension of work in the government printing office on December 15th, and that a larger sum will be necessary to do the work which congress has directed to be done. This should not be news to the appropriation committee of the house. The late public printer, Mr. Rounds, whose estimates were always accurate, informed the house appropriation committee that unless appropriations should be made which, in some degree, corresponded with the amount of printing which congress ordered to be done, exactly the thing would happen which has now happened, it would be necessary to dismiss most of the force.
