In order that his views of this matter should be made more public and that it should be deep seated in the mind of the public, he in his inaugural address proclaimed that:

Heads of departments, bureaus and all other public officers having any duty connected therewith will be expected to enforce the civil service law fully and without evasion.

Harrison's views in this matter do not seem to be entertained by the heads of departments, as Secretary of the Interior Noble said but a few days ago that:

In making removals and appointments republicans will get all the favors. It may just as well be understood at the outset that the department is not to be conducted for the benefit of democracy.

This you see is in flat contradiction to the views of Harrison on this important subject, and the TELEPHONE-REGISTER is inclined to think that Harrison has settled himself down to pure republican doctrine and intends to boss the reign of unadulterated spoilism to the best of his immense ability in that line.
