HENRY W. GRADY.

Henry W. Grady, editor of the Atlanta Constitution, is dead. This takes another bright mind from the field of democratic journalism.

The Oregonian leaves out its usual obituary on the democratic dead and pays him well deserved praise in the following words:

The sudden death of Henry W. Grady, of the Atlanta Constitution, narrows the list of Southern editors of national reputation and commanding character down to one.

Mr. Henry Watterson stands alone, as he did ten years ago, as a representative of the South among a small group of American journalists whose personal character commands respect, and whose spoken or written utterances always command attention.

THE SPEAKERSHIP.

Counting Thomas B. Reed, present incumbent, there have been in all, since the organization of the house of representatives on April 1, 1875, 31 speakers. This does not include speakers elected pro tempore.

Fifteen speakers were under 40 years of age at the time of their election. The youngest speaker was Robert M. T. Hunter, of Virginia, who was but 30 years of age when chosen to preside over the twenty-sixth congress.

Mr. Reed's election, next to him came Henry Clay, who was in his 24th year when called to the chair by the twelfth congress, November 4, 1811.

Kentucky has had the speakership longer than any other state—twelve terms. Henry Clay served six; John White, one, Minn Boyd, one, and John G. Carlisle, three.
