TO UTILIZE NIAGARA FALLS. M. Maginn, a mechanical engineer living at 2222 Wabash avenue, Chicago, has been awarded a gold medal by the Buffalo International Fair association for his device for utilizing the power of Niagara Falls.

Mr. Maginn proposes to have excavated a cavity or drift at the foot of the falls, in front of which the flow of water will be continuous and of sufficient depth to carry over all kinds of ice without striking the rocks. In this respect, upon stone foundations, will be a stationary iron truss frame, upon which, on wheels, will be a traveling truss frame sufficient, by heavy to carry the water-wheel and other paraphernalia, this consisting of an overhead wheel sixty feet in diameter, several monster dynamos, and the gearing necessary to work them.

RUSSIAN EMANCIPATION.

After a trial of a quarter of a century the emancipation act is now acknowledged to have utterly failed, says a writer in the Westcott Crutcher, the reporter of the Russian officials, of statistical professors at Moscow, such as Jansen and the nihilists with Stepiak at their head, all alike agree that the misery of the rural class is greater than even in the days of serfdom; cultivation is at the lowest ebb, the yield wretched, and less than in any other European country.

Each peasant must plow, sow and reap as his neighbors do. The three-field system of corn, green crops, and fallow, which was abandoned in all good agriculture long ago, goes on with disastrous results. As the lots are changed by the mir at their pleasure, after every year, the temporary owner does not care to manure, etc., or even to improve his land. Although the rent is sometimes as low as two shillings an acre, the peasant can not live.

Agriculture is a business requiring capital, knowledge and sufficient amount of land to enable different crops to be grown, so that if one fails it does not mean starvation, for another may succeed. The Russian peasant has none of these qualifications. The peasant proprietors can neither pay the money owing to the government for their land, nor even the state and communal taxes, and are flooded by hundreds for non-payment.

In one district of Novgorod 1,500 peasants were thus condemned in 1887. Five hundred and fifty had already been flogged when the inspector interceded for the remainder. Widespread famine is found over a great part of the country. Usurers, the base of peasant proprietors in all countries, are in possession of the situation. The Koukals and Jew "mir eaters" supply money on mortgage, they foreclose, and, when the land is in their own possession, get the work done for nothing at interest.

These "bondage laborers," as they are called, are, in fact, slaves, and are nearly starved, while the small plots are often rented into considerable estates, and their new owners consider they have only rights and no duties. Meanwhile, as forced labor is at an end, and free labor is of the worst possible kind, the old land owners can get nothing done. They have tried to employ machines, bought by borrowing from the banks, and are now unable to repay the money.

The upper class has been ruined, with no advantage to the peasant. "The wasteful culture of the cottier," Stepiak calls it, "on these small plots is so bad that the general welfare of the country," says Professor Jansen, "is in danger by the small yield of the soil. In spite of the philanthropic intentions of the late czar, he is believed to have aimed at diminishing the power of the nobles as much as improving the condition of the peasants. He succeeded. The nobles in many districts are ruined, and there is nothing but the unlimited power of the autocrat and his 90,000,000 subjects, five-sixth of whom are peasants."

TANNER'S ONLY REPORT. According to Ex-Commissioner Tanner's report, just issued, there are 489,725 pensioners, of whom 351,489 are army invalids, 603 survivors of the war of 1812 and 17065 survivors of the war with Mexico. Since 1861, 789,112 pensions have been allowed.

The amount paid for pensions during the last year was \$88,275,113.28, an increase of \$9,499,251.26. Ex-Commissioner Tanner is not satisfied with the amount which the government is paying out on this account and he urges more liberality.

Among other recommendations he advises that a widow's pension, suspended for her immorality, shall be continued to her minor children.

He wants \$22 added to the pension of every one who is now receiving \$50 a month.

He wants pensions for all dependent persons who have had sons or brothers on the pension list, no matter whether they were dependent on the soldiers or not dependent in Tanner's vernacular means poor.

THE NICARAGUA CANAL.

The text that has this week been published of the agreement between the government of Nicaragua and the Mariposa Canal company of Nicaragua by which are settled the difficulties arising from the company having them, at it necessary to secure a concession from the republic of Costa Rica, a view of the matter which was presented by Nicaragua as incompatible with the terms of the Cardenas-Mendoza local contract. By the terms of this agreement the canal company agrees to adhere strictly to the stipulations of that contract in the operation of the canal on its completion, and to regard as null any other engagements contracted by it that may be incompatible with the Cardenas-Mendoza contract, or with the rights of Nicaragua, whose exclusive sovereignty over the canal and its ports the company recognize and bind itself to respect. In return the government of Nicaragua revokes the orders prohibiting the formal commencement of the works of construction of the canal, and approves the plans thereof which have been presented, with the exception of the port on the Atlantic, which must be constructed on shores and in waters strictly Nicaraguan, and guarantees to the company all the rights necessary for the construction of the canal in accordance with the Cardenas-Mendoza contract, and to the extent of the legal power of the republic.—Bradstreet.

Appearances would indicate that France is preparing for another war. Certain prominent people in the employ of the French government, says the Boston Advertiser, recently wrote to large brokers in the United States asking for information as to the means for and the possibility of making large shipments of American wheat to that country. They have designated the ports of delivery and the time to be allowed in making shipments, but have left the matter of price open to future agreement. This certainly would seem to indicate that France, while not perhaps desiring war, certainly does not intend to be left in the lurch in case a war should suddenly arise. A war that should involve Russia and Germany and blockade the ports of India and send the price of American wheat up with a rush. Then American farmers would realize that they had two competing nations on this continent to contend with. Both Canada and the Argentine are becoming large exporters of cereals and breadstuffs.

Bell's telephone monopoly is confronted with two dangerous enemies. Gray's telegraph is one of these and Esick's type-writing telegraph the other. The former device transmits writing perfectly, and properly applied would take the place of the telephone, having the additional advantage of greater secrecy. The latter device is not so well known. The system has been in operation between Chicago and New York for some time, using one of the Postal Telegraph company's wires. Its use in short circuits was proven practically some time ago, but kept secret. Robbed of technicalities, the system is simple one by which a type writer at one end of the line is made to transmit currents of varying intensity which operate a type-writer at the other end.
