OREGON TIMBER IN EUROPE. Its Superiority Recognized by Shipbuilders and a Larger Market Prospective.

The Mississippi Valley Lumberman, in its issue of March 7, contains the following in regard to Oregon timber:

Oregon is beginning to attract attention in England. The Timber Trades Journal of London devotes something like a page to "Oregon Pine and Its Probable Uses," and remarks that up to last year that wood had been occasionally imported into England, but that dealers have now begun to keep up a full supply.

The weather in the world grows right here, but it takes the rest of the world some little time to find it out. The West-foot state will not become noted for its excellent timber, of which it possesses an unlimited supply.

With this begins the weekly weather-crop bulletin of Oregon for 1890. Arrangements have been made with prominent farmers, representatives of this service and others, in every county of the state to render weekly reports of the conditions of crops, their progress and prospects, the effects of the weather on them, and in general, information that will accrue to the benefit of the farmers, merchant and others.

The weather in the forepart of the week cool; rain or snow was generally experienced. The temperature rose in latter part of the week, when warmth and sunshine prevailed.

The ground is generally too wet for plowing, though in sections plowing is in progress. The snow has generally left, leaving the wheat in good condition, and fair grass for stock.

On March 18th, 1890, flowers, peach, cherry, apple and plum trees were in full bloom in most parts of the state. 1890 is about three weeks later in the opening of spring.
