Mother of how many children and how many of these children living. Place of birth. Place of birth of father and mother.

Whether naturalized. Whether naturalization papers have been taken out. Profession, trade or occupation.

Months unemployed during the census year. Attendance at school during the census year. Able to read; able to write.

Whether suffering from acute or chronic disease, with name of disease and length of time afflicted. Whether defective in mind, sight, hearing or taste, or whether crippled, maimed or deformed, with name of defect.

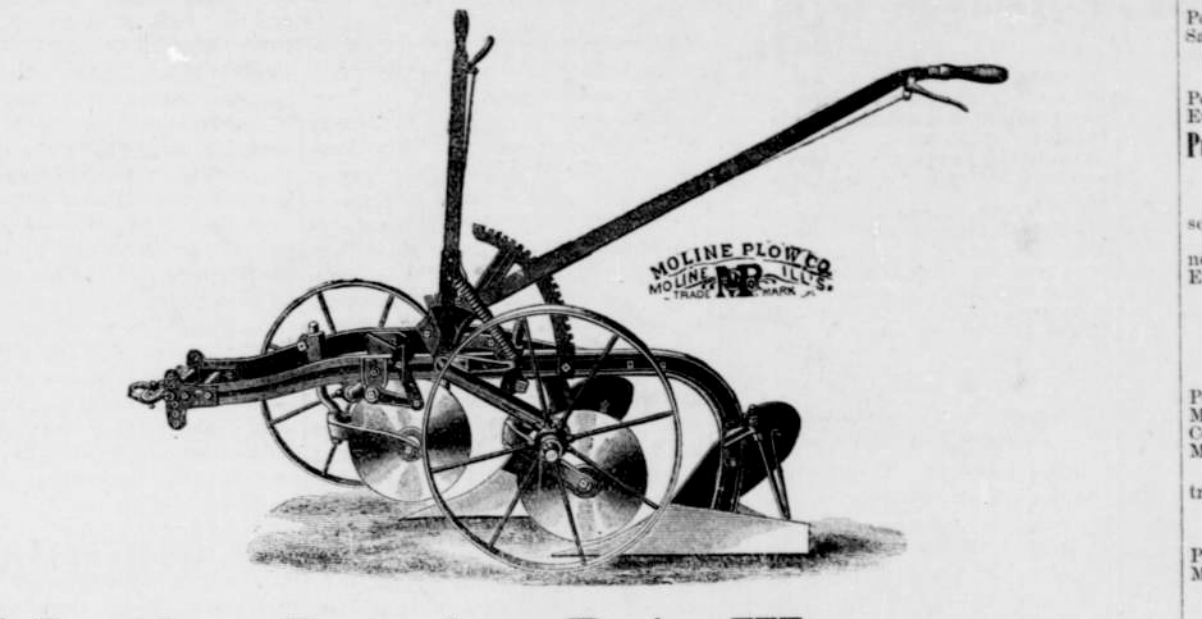
