PETITIONERS ANSWERED.

The Board of Directors Explain Why the Petition Could Not be Granted.

To David Stout, Eugene Leoper, Milton Arthur, Frank Dymun, H. C. Edwards and others.

Gentlemen: Your petition to the directors of school district No. 40, praying for the erection of two school houses instead of one as provided for at the annual school meeting, is this day filed and after due consideration is respectfully denied for the following reasons to wit:

First—The petition does not contain a majority of the legal voters of said district; see clerks report for year 1922 which gives the total number of voters 478, not counting the women which in law are allowed to vote at school meeting, making the total over 600 in the district.

Second—The law expressly prohibits the board from diverting the funds of the district otherwise than for the express purpose of dividing the section 4, Art. 9 of school laws of Oregon, page 107.

Third—At a mass meeting held subsequent to the annual meeting, the proposition of erecting two school houses was submitted and after a thorough discussion, was emphatically voted down.

Fourth—The progressive spirit of the age and the intelligence and energy of this community demands an intelligent foresight in the management of the public schools of this city. No man's personal or financial interest should decide the location or construction of a public school building—the poor man's heritage. Nor should the machinations of a few obstructionists be allowed to thwart the will of the majority, hence the directors, under oath, and realizing the responsibility of their position, wishing only to accomplish the most good to the greatest number, have selected a central and slightly elevated location, and have adapted plans which will give to McMinnville one of the finest arranged school buildings in the state, of its size and which will be furnished with all the modern appliances.

In conclusion, gentlemen, the directors are endeavoring to perform their duty conscientiously with a due regard alike for the tax-payer and children, and when their efforts shall fail to command your confidence and esteem be assured that any manifestation on your part for a change of management will be hailed with delight.
