The permanent organization of the Oregon legislature was effected the first day of the session and Fulton and Keady presides over the senate, while Keady of Portland performs the same office in the house.

The routine report of the proceedings of the two branches is as follows: The senate was called to order by O. P. Miller at 2:30 p. m.

Willis offered a resolution inviting the clergy of the state to open each morning with a prayer. This and the rules of last session were adopted.

A concurrent resolution was adopted to appoint a committee of two from the senate and three from the house to wait upon the governor and inform him that the legislature is in session and ready to hear any communication he might wish to make.
