BUTTER MAKING.

Experience shows that we get a greater quantity of cream by setting deep dishes of milk. Some of the best creameries plunge deep cans in cold water, and after a few hours take off several inches of cream. This article is written in the interests of home butter-making, even in a small way; but we find better, more manageable cream-from five inches of milk set in one pan, than from two and a half inches each in two pans.


