**Statesman:** We have made inquiry of farmers from all parts of the county, and from what we can learn the fruit crop will be light compared with former years, particularly in this the case with the pear crop, which has always been in former years very prolific, but this year in some orchards it is an entire failure, while but few orchards will yield the usual crop. Prunes, too, have suffered very much, so that the yield will not exceed more than half the usual amount. The apple crop will be much lighter than usual, while there will be plenty of fruit for home consumption. We doubt very much if there will be much of a surplus to ship. There will not be the thousands of bushels of apples and pears left in the orchards to rot this fall that has been for many years past, for two reasons: 1st, the crop is much lighter than usual, and 2nd, the country is filling up very rapidly and the demand for home consumption is much greater than it has ever been before. And unless there are more orchards planted, soon the fruit crop will be short in the future. Farmers must take better care of their orchards in the future than they have in the past, for as soon as the Northern Pacific Railroad is completed, our fine fruit will find a ready market in the Eastern States at very remunerative prices.
